Fly Tipping Doesn't Pay!

A local tree surgeon has been fined more than £3,000 by Cheshire East Council after he pleaded guilty to depositing felled timber and other waste on land off the main A34 at Moreton earlier this year. He was also to carry out 100 hours of unpaid community work too.

He was spotted in March by a local farmer as he was unloading his truck in a field. He was blocked in by another member of the public to stop him driving away, until the police arrived. Cheshire East Council has the power to prosecute fly tippers who dump their waste on public or private property and appear to be enforcing this policy!

Children in the juniors were excited to have a visit from Google - the Internet Legends Team. They learnt how to behave on the internet and how to keep themselves safe - they learnt about the over sharer, the cyber bully, the phisher and the hacker. The green and red voting hands ensured it was a really interactive lesson and children enjoyed playing the internet legends game to practise their safety knowledge.

Linked to the centenary of the end of WW1, children in both junior classes have been learning about the wars. The year three and four children had a visit from Mr Shipton, a school parent, to learn about aeroplanes used during WW1. They enjoyed seeing the models and watching them fly!

A visit to Congleton Veterinary Centre has been a highlight for children in reception. They took their dogs in as they were ill - they weighed, bandaged, x-rayed and checked the heart rates of each one, as well as putting them in post-operative care.
